

San Miguel County Notice and Request for Public Comment

Legislation passed by the 2009 Colorado General Assembly (HB09-1015) allows Colorado Primary Elections to be conducted as mail ballot elections upon approval by the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC). Pursuant to C.R.S. 1-7.5-105(1)(b), prior to a final determination being made, the County Clerk and Recorder is required to give public notice and seek public comment on such determination.

A mail ballot election means that all eligible electors will be sent ballots in the mail, regardless of whether they are on the Permanent Mail-In Voter list or not. Ballots may be returned by mail or dropped off in two locations in Telluride or one in Norwood. In addition, an ADA approved voting machine will be available in Telluride for those who cannot vote by paper ballot.

The 2012 Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 26. Any person who wishes to submit comment regarding the San Miguel County Clerk and Recorder, as designated election official, conducting this election as a mail ballot election may send comments to:
